Renewal House is the January Special Plate Collection Recipient. As you may recall, in past years we have organized a



special stand alone collection effort for the UU Urban Ministry's Renewal House during the holidays. This year, we have decided to make Renewal House the recipient of our special plate collection instead. We hope each of you who have donated generously in the past will do so again this year. The Social Justice Council is hoping to make this one of the ways we connect more directly to the Urban Ministry and its programs, which was one of the goals coming out of our discussion on our focus for the future. Given our congregation's desire to focus on antiracism, the Urban Ministry is a natural fit for exploring how we can best continue this work.

For those of you who are not familiar with Renewal House, here is the description from the UUUM website:

Renewal House is a domestic violence shelter for individuals and families who are fleeing violence or abuse. Since 1980, Renewal House has provided temporary emergency shelter and advocacy services to more than 1,000 individuals and families escaping domestic violence. Renewal House was one of the first domestic violence shelters in the state to provide shelter for male survivors as well as female, and is sought out by other agencies for its expertise in attending to the spiritual needs of survivors. Renewal House works closely with other programs that serve the LGBTQ communities, as well as those that serve elders and individuals with disabilities to provide the best support we can to these underserved populations
