December Board Update

November 17 Parish Meeting

On November 17, the Board gathered voting members for an all parish meeting to vote on two articles; Article 1 related to acceptance of a revised 2024/2025 budget. Article 2 related to authorizing the Board to



apply for grant reimbursement for critical Meeting House projects. Both of these articles were unanimously approved.

November 7 Business Meeting

The Board also met on November 7 for a monthly business meeting. Below are items of interest not noted elsewhere in the newsletter.

MA Peace Action Resolution; A speaker was recognized and spoke about the Social Justice Council (SJC) request for the Board to sign a MA Peace Action Resolution urging Senators Markey and Warren to "cosponsor and vote in favor of the Joint Resolutions of Disapproval (JRDs) (S.J.Res.111 to S.J.Res.116) <u>introduced on September 25 by Senators Sanders</u>, Welch, Schatz and Merkley to block the delivery of an additional \$20B of U.S. weapons to Israel, over and above the record-breaking amount of \$17.9B in weapons already delivered since October 7, 2023." The Board voted unanimously to sign the resolution and First Parish Hingham, Old Ship Church Board of Trustees was added shortly thereafter to this resolution.

2024-2025 Budget: The Board approved a revised version of the 24/25 budget. The budget for a lead teacher for the Children's Religious Education program was increased to \$4,800 to reflect the possibility for additional

teaching time should the program grow. A unanimous vote recommended the budget be presented for congregational approval at a meeting set for Nov. 17.

Building Committee Report: Janice McPhillips, liaison to the Building Committee, spoke about the Building Committee's request for a congregational vote permitting the Board to apply for grants for critical Meeting House projects. Building Committee member Ron Pollara was recognized and explained that grant applications request a guarantee that applicants can provide 120% of the funded amount so that a congregational vote is necessary. These grants will reimburse critical meeting house projects initially paid for by the parish. Ron advised that the total for the grants would not exceed \$340,000. The Board voted unanimously to present an article for congregational vote at a Parish Meeting set for Nov. 17.

Hiring a lead CRE teacher. Trish McAleer, acting Chairperson for the Children's Religious Education (CRE) Committee, proposed that, as the CRE program is rebuilding this year, it would be more practical to hire a lead teacher in lieu of Director of RE. The Board agreed. Trish will work up a job description and advertise the position first to the congregation.

Transition Ministry Team Selection: Corey Fitz-Marquez advised that she, Judi Flaherty and Rev. Carie had assessed the nominees for the new Transition Ministry team and were recommending the following members; Chris Johnson, Ruben Marquez, Rob Baynes, Caitlin Gibson, Myrah West, Sarah Corey.

Merrie Market Board Table: The board agreed to a request to staff a table at Merrie Maret which would offer people information on the church.

Friends of the Homeless Dinner: Dinner is scheduled for Tuesday December 17 at the Congregational Church in Hingham. Janice will make an announcement into the newsletter and will coordinate volunteers for the event.

December Special Plate/Outreach Collection: Unitarian Universalist Service Committee Guest at Your Table Program — Guest at Your Table (GAYT) is UUSC's annual intergenerational program to raise support for and awareness about key human rights issues. Since it began in 1975, GAYT has introduced generations of Unitarian Universalists to our grassroots partners working for justice around the world with your support. This year's theme is "Expanding the Welcome Table." Our guests represent some of the most important work being undertaken by UUSC at this critical time in our national history. You will meet young climate activists in the Marshall Islands helping their communities heal from the destructive legacy of nuclear testing by the United States while envisioning a sustainable future for their people; LGBTQ+ leaders in Ukraine offering resources and companionship to the queer community impacted by Russia's full-scale invasion; Haitian academics researching racism's impacts on the experiences of migrants of color in the United States; and Trans organizers forming networks of safety and welcome for trans and gender expansive people forced to flee unsafe communities and states.

Throughout December, we will learn more about this year's guests, but you also can learn more about them through the Stories of Hope book, available online at <u>UUSC-24-25GAYTStories-of-Hope-Booklet_Final.pdf</u>. We also will

distribute hard copies of this book in the Meeting House.

Printer Cartridge Collection


