
# Sunday, June 30 Karen Churchill Storytelling

#### Minister's musings for July, 2024 Rev. Edmund Robinson

One of the oldest lecture series in America is the Berry Street Essay. It was started when William Ellery Channing was minister of the Federal Street Church in downtown Boston. As I remember the story, Berry Street was a side street to the church and the minister's office had a door opening onto it. So the lecturer series arose out of periodic meetings that the ministers had in those days.



In my time, the Berry Street Essay has always been the last event at Ministry Days, the three-day meeting of members of the UU Minister's Association (UUMA). A different speaker is chosen every year. This year it was Rev. Kim Crawford Harvie, long-time and recently retired minister of the Arlington Street Church in Boston's Back Bay.

I well knew her talents as a preacher, because I had recruited her to preach at my installation in Chatham in 2009. But her Berry Street preaching yesterday reached a whole new level.

Her title was typical Kim wordplay: "Mystery Loves Company." The central thesis, illustrated by many heart-opening stories, was that in a denomination with as broad a range of theologies as UU has, the job of the minister is to keep us awake and open to the mysteries that surround us at all times. In Rilke's words, to live the questions instead of "solving" or trying to "answer" them.

#### **Board of Trustees July Update**

The Board of Trustees met on June 6th for our monthly business meeting and again for a special session June 20th. Below are some items of note from those meetings not discussed elsewhere:



Next Minister Hired! Based on the strong

recommendation of our Minister Search Team, we are very pleased to announce that the Board has hired Rev. Carie Johnsen (she/her) to be our next contract Minister. Rev. Carie has over 15 years of experience in Congregational Ministry and Chaplaincy. A fuller biography of Rev. Carie can be found **at this link.** Rev. Carie will officially come on board August 1st. We are very excited to work in close partnership with Rev Carie in this next year. Congratulates to the Ministry Search Team on a job well done!

**Budget Discussions** Though a budget of was approved at the Annual Meeting, due to lower than expected pledges, a deficit of 50K currently exists. The Board discussed several options for closing this fiscal gap to include using a surplus of funds remaining from last year. Also considered was requesting members to increase their pledges when possible. The Board will revisit the budget again this fall in collaboration with our new minister. Should an budget adjustment be needed, a revised budget will presented for Congregation approval.

**The Building Committee:** Though the efforts of Ron Pollara, Nina Wellford, and Tom Willson we have received a grant for \$11,141 from the the Greenbush Historic Trust which will be used toward a new sound system for the Meeting House. Other funds to support the new sound system will come from a \$3,500 grant from the Reynolds Family Trust, Friends of the Meeting House will contribute \$7,000 to the project. Roy Harris and Eileen McIntyre will contribute \$2,500 to the project as well. The remainder of the funds required will come from the Old Ship budget. Also the engraving on the Minister's plaque with Ken's retirement date was completed and the plaque has been rehung. Lastly, the Friends of Old Ship Meeting House will be starting a Pew Cleaning Project on July 9th and are looking for volunteers to participate. Please contact Nina Wellford or Janice McPhillips if you'd like more information.

**Children's RE Next Year**: As members have expressed support for a reimagined Children's Religious Education program, the Board has agreed to oversee an outreach this fall to gauge the interest and commitment from our Old Ship families. We note that our 2024/2025 budget earmarks approximately 46K for a DRE and RE program expenses.

In its June meeting, the Board voted to approve moving forward with Torrey Architecture on an initial phase for designing a new Parish House. Architectural and engineering work will begin shortly that will result in a detailed proposal by September/October for the full project. That



proposal will be submitted to the congregation for a vote. Torrey Architecture is a leading firm in houses of worship design in New England, having worked on over 30 churches and synagogues.



#### UUA GENERAL ASSEMBLY VIRTUAL GA · JUNE 20 - 23, 2024

**Brief Update from UUA's General Assembly:** This past weekend, Eva Marx, Ellie Handleman, and Davalene Cooper were our Old Ship delegates to General Assemby, which was held as an online event. The revisions to Article 2 passed with a vote of 80% in favor. You may learn more about the vote and debate at Article II Results: New Unitarian Universalist Association Statement of Values Passes after General Assembly Delegate Vote | UU World Magazine. The business resolution, "Embracing Transgender, Nonbinary, Intersex and Gender Diverse People is a Fundamental Expression of UU Religious Values" also passed by a majority vote. Three Actions of Immediate Witness passed: (1) World on Fire: Humanitarian Work and Climate Change, (2) Centering Love Amidst the Ongoing Impact of COVID-19, and (3) Solidarity with Palestinians. Additionally, there was one Responsive Resolution that was passed--UUA GA Support for October 7 Hostages. And finally, you are invited to watch the Sunday morning worship service at GA 2024 Sunday Service (youtube.com).

#### News from the Social Justice Council (SJC)

Special Summer Service from the Social Justice Council on July 14 — Instead of a more traditional summer service, the SJC will be showing the documentary film, *Cooked:* 



Survival by Zip Code. "In the summer of 1995, Chicago experienced an unthinkable disaster, when extremely high humidity and a layer of heatretaining pollution drove the heat index up to more than 126 degrees. *Cooked: Survival by Zip Code* tells the story of this tragic heatwave, the most traumatic in U.S. history, in which 739 citizens died over the course of just a single week, most of them poor, elderly, and African American." We will be showing the film at 14 Main, and due to the distribution rights, we cannot show the film on Zoom, so there will not be a Zoom link for this specific service. We will be providing food and beverages for our audience. The movie is about 80 minutes in length. There will be time to discuss the film for those who wish to stay a bit longer to do so. We hope to see you on July 14 for this important part of our social justice work!
