In person canvassing in swing states for anyone who might like to travel:

- Philadelphia Sept. 6-8 (Rev. Dr. Sofia Betancourt will be attending)
- Pittsburgh Sept. 20-22
- Athens (GA) Sept. 28 this action is led by a partner organization
- Dallas/Fort Worth Oct. 4-6 (Rev. Dr. Sofia Betancourt will attend)
- Phoenix Oct. 25-27
- North Carolina late October this action is also led by a partner organization
- Wisconsin/Florida/Colorado Nov. 1-5

In addition, there will be weekly phone banks on Tuesday evenings, 7-9 pm, starting Aug. 27 through Oct. 29.
