#### **Community Space Team Update**

Our architect, David Torrey, provided the Community Space Team with a revised plan for the new parish house that reduces it in size and scope in an effort to bring the project in line with our budget. The plan includes various



options that we may want to undertake if the budget allows. The Team has given the revised plan to several qualified contractors for their construction cost estimates and expects to receive these estimates within a few weeks. Once the estimates are in, the Team will vet them and consider the various options that the plans have outlined. This process will take several weeks at a minimum. Once the Team is able to fully assess the estimates, it will make a recommendation to the Board and Congregation on how to proceed.
